IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS IN PROGRESS

With the moisture from winter having now largely dried up, construction has resumed on our continuing upgrade projects. Last week saw the removal of the gravel in the concourse and beer garden and its replacement with crush which, will provide a much-improved walkway and passage, particularly for those with mobility issues.



In addition, work has now begun on the conversion of the tractor shed into the planned entry plaza and office. That work will see the current metal siding replaced with rough lumber and a western façade, a display area with storage and office on the inside, and a western-themed boardwalk on the inner concourse side of the building.

LIVESTOCK SHED PLANS ADOPTED BY BOARD

We previously reported that last fall, the directors resolved to build a loafing shed inside the large livestock corral, known as the “bull pen”. We recognize that livestock contained in that area occasionally require shelters from either wind, sun or other severe weather conditions. Directors

Randy Rogers and Greg Alexander have agreed to manage the construction and a rough design has been approved that envisions a structure approximately 32 feet wide by 16 feet deep, positioned against the interior of the corral fence on the north side. We are looking for used or donated materials in an effort to reduce the cost of purchasing new lumber. The building will need at least six large posts, either 6”x 6” dimensional or round posts, as well as 2x10 roof joists/ rafters and rough
