Tyca Music Festival

An eclectic evening of music featuring an array of up-and-coming young talent from around Taunton. The evening will showcase acoustic artists and bands and features a special collaborative commission with the hugely talented young Somerset composer, JJ Hathaway, and Simon Chalk with members of the Southern Sinfonia in what promises to be a spectacular melting pot of creativity and inspiration.

The performance will be the culmination of a number of weeks of workshops and rehearsals, that will see the young musicians being given unfettered access to their Southern Sinfonia counterparts, soaking up all of the experiences that these wonderful musicians can show them.
