

Best Practices

The following document outlines best practices for the application, storage and care of Bandit products.

- Bandit should be stored at room temperature, never frozen and kept away from extended exposure direct sunlight.
- The Bandit nozzle should be removed and cleaned with isopropyl alcohol or brake cleaner.
- Bandit can be poured into a separate (clean) container for storage, or to lighten the jug for application purposes.
- Bandit should only be applied in fair weather. Exposing Bandit to freezing temperatures or precipitation before the curing period will dramatically reduce the products strength and life span.
- Bandit should not be applied to any type of soil or stone greater than ¼ inch, gaps created using larger material will not allow the product to bond.
- For large projects, a powered spray unit may be used. The sprayer must be capable of handling chemicals and high viscosity liquids. A standard garden sprayer will not suffice.
- Please note: overspray will not be apparent until product cures. Areas or objects you wish to keep free of overspray should be covered / shielded. Overspray can be removed with brake cleaner or isopropyl alcohol only while product is still wet.
- For weed control, the area to be treated should be cleared of vegetation prior to application.
