Dear Clavis Community,

As always, our teachers plan with the end in mind. For our students, this means looking at what we need to do so our students are set up for success when they start the next year—regardless of where that might be.

We are planning and preparing for when things will happen (eg, 2022 school calendar), who students will be learning from (eg, 2022 teacher placements), who students will be learning with (eg, 2022 class lists), and how our school will continue to improve and evolve (eg, strategic plan), among many other things. 

2022 Start Date: With the proposed removal of quarantine for vaccinated individuals, families are beginning to plan for their Summer holidays and thinking about return dates. The 2022 calendar is not finalised yet but students will likely be starting back during the **week of 10 January**. As a precaution, families should be considering allowing time to isolate at home, depending on where they travel to, prior to sending children back to school. More information will be coming out about the 2022 calendar in September.

School Timings: A reminder that for Pre-Reception to Year 1, pick up is at 14:15 (12:05 Fridays) and for Years 2 to Year 6, pick up will be by 14:45 (12:35 Fridays). Please help our staff and those supervising students by respecting these times.

COVID Protocols: A few other schools have closed partially or fully due to a positive case connected directly to a member of staff or student. Typically students and staff have been asked to self-isolate for three days while the school gets disinfected and they get tested. We must all remain vigilant and be over-cautious to protect our community. Please see the attachment guidelines we are following that was sent to parents on Monday 23 August. In the event that anyone in a family may have had contact with a positive individual at work or otherwise, do not send your child to school until you are certain nothing could have been passed on to your child. If in doubt, as we are doing at school, it is always better to err on the side of caution.

Staggered Days: We have information that schools will continue with the staggered days unless we have been told otherwise by the government. Unfortunately, government schools start holidays for the next two weeks so we may not receive any new updates until later in the second week of September. When we have new information this will be shared with the community immediately.

This must be completed by 3 September, giving you one week. After that time we will begin budgeting for next year, planning our new class lists, and contacting families on our waiting lists about new spaces. UPDATE ON ADMISSIONS TO LE BOCAGE

The anxiety that parents have about the options for their children when they leave Clavis after Year 6 is undoubtedly a top concern. We have continued to make inroads with LBIS on our community's behalf to get something resolved that will reduce the anxiety and concerns. As stated in the parent letter from the previous week, there is a proposal with LBIS's Board that their administration has put forward that will reserve seats for our students and remove future issues of possibly not having enough space.



We are waiting for their next Board meeting during the beginning of September and I hope to be able to provide a final update in our next Chronicle on 9 September. Following this, Mr David Jenkins, Head of School at LBIS,

has offered to meet with our community to explain details of the new proposal and answer any questions our parents have. This will likely be a joint Zoom forum with Mr Hart, and we will hopefully be able to provide a date and time for this at the same time that we share details about the policy updates.

THE PYP EXHIBITION— WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YEAR 6?

As some of you may be aware, Year 6 has started undertaking an important component of their final year in the PYP: The PYP Exhibition. The IB explains that in "...the final year of the PYP, students, carry out an extended, in-depth, collaborative project known as the PYP exhibition.

This involves students working collaboratively to conduct an in-depth inquiry into real life issues or problems. Students collectively synthesise all of the essential elements of the PYP in ways that can be shared with the whole school community. It also provides teachers with a powerful and authentic process for assessing student understanding.

The exhibition represents a unique and significant opportunity for students to exhibit the attributes of the IB learner profile developed throughout their engagement with the PYP.

It also provides schools and students with a wonderful opportunity to celebrate the transition of learners to the next phase of their education." link

For Year 6, the students have been working with their teachers unpacking and understanding the Transdisciplinary theme "Sharing the planet". They then explored the various focus areas that could be inquired into and selected ones that are meaningful to them.

This week, the students are now jumping into the full Exhibition process. They have been exploring different topics to inquire into and have given rationale behind their choice. They have also decided whether they would like to work in small groups or individually. They have now been assigned a teacher mentor who will support and guide them throughout the process. Next week, they will write their central idea and the key concepts will be carefully selected. This will support them in writing their lines of inquiry and student questions for investigation.

For our Year 6 parents, they will be able to follow the process and the child's progress on Google Classroom.

This is a new experience for our students and, like last year, we are planning to go ahead with a virtual exhibition, with each group designing and preparing a website to present their work and findings.
