When paying for your order, you will have to confirm your child's name, class and school to ensure you are on the correct platform.

We usually expect a delivery approximately 4 weeks after the closing date of the book club. The orders should arrive in early November, plenty of time for summer reading. The books will be delivered and sorted at school before being delivered to your child's classroom. If it is a surprise gift, please let us know so we deliver them to you directly.

Please be aware that while delivery is free, your total will include a small fee for duty purposes in Mauritius. This fee represents 5% of your order.

### **SPORTS DAY - TUESDAY, 4 OCTOBER**

A s you are aware, we are excited to finally have a full-school event that will also include all parents. Our PE department has spent many weeks planning, preparing, and helping the students practice for our upcoming Sports Day on Tuesday the 4th of October. Our PTA has also been hugely busy making sure everything is in place to make this a wonderful experience for students, staff, and parents. This includes providing things like food and drink, banners, trophies, and even some bouncy castles (for the students). Eve-



ryone is getting involved and everyone is invited. There are, however, some important requirements to be aware of that parents must consider to help us make this a successful and enjoyable day for all. Our biggest challenge for events like this is and has always been parking. To help parents manage the congestion and the challenges of finding parking spaces, and for parents and students to have a wonderful day please note the following:

- This is a normal school day, with regular arrival and dismissal times (with a couple of exceptions below).
- Students should be dressed to celebrate their house and colour: Red, Blue, or Yellow. If you are not sure which colour your child is (which is the same for siblings), please check with homeroom teachers.
- Sporting events will take place on the level 3 pitch, while the other activities (bouncing castles, Zumba sessions, medal ceremony, and jungle gym) will take place on the other fields or levels.
- The PTA has arranged additional recognitions to be able to give individual trophies to the highest performing athletes (boys and girls) in Year 4, 5, and 6.
- Guests of honor will be Miss Jerusha Ramasawmy and Julie Gopal. They are ex-Clavis students, winners of the FIFA Grassroots tournament when they were with Clavis, and members of the women's Mauritius national football team (ie, Club M or *Les Dodos*).
- All parents are invited to come and encourage the young athletes for their sports events and medal ceremony. See the timetable below for which time to come (Events & Medals). After these events, parents are expected to leave to allow for the next parent groups arriving.
- Available parking is very limited and there will never be enough space for everyone. Spaces consist of the main lot, spaces beside the road before the first gate, and along the road moving towards LBIS. Whenever possible, families should consider car-pooling or arranging to get dropped off.
- Pre-Reception, Reception and Year 1 parents are free to take their child home instead of returning later at dismissal time. Parents must inform their homeroom teacher and should sign a form prior to the early dismissal of their child.
- Coffee and snacks will be available for parents in the morning, while dhall puri and alooda will be available later in the day. Compliments of the PTA!
- To lessen waste, we will not have plastic water bottles available. Both students and parents should bring their reusable water bottles.
