Additionally, you will also find information on an upcoming LBIS trail run to raise money for community projects the school is involved with. It is for all parents and students who are 12 or older.


Finally, we have included information about an upcoming open swim day, as well as the summer holiday camp at Clavis. Please see this information and attachment if you would like to have your child get involved.



What is a Christmas Box?

A Christmas Box is a mixture of essential items and gifts to the value of Rs 700 assembled by a donor for an underprivileged child.

What is a Food Hamper?

A Food Hamper is a mixture of essential food items to the value of Rs 2500 assembled by a donor for an underprivileged family.

In 2020 we successfully delivered 625 Christmas boxes and 103 families received food hampers.

Once you have registered with us

- 1 We will in turn reply to you with the recipients' details, provide you with a guide on how to fill your Christmas Box or Food Hamper, and give you the official drop-off zones.
- 2 **For a Christmas Box pledge**
Find a shoe box no bigger than 35cm(L) x 25cm(W) x 15cm(H)
For a Food Hamper pledge
Use 2 large reusable shopping bags
- 3 Fill your box using the guide
- 4 Decorate your box with wrapping, ribbons and/or stickers
- 5 Fill out the checklist label we supply you, cut it out and stick it to the top of the box



Last day of drop off is the end of November

How to pack your Christmas Box

Find an empty shoe box

Find a shoe box no bigger than: 35cm(L) x 25cm(W) x 15cm(H). The lid and the bottom should be made separable, so that the lid can be lifted off.

Decorate the shoe box

Wrap the shoe box and the lid separately so that the box can open. Be creative, use wrapping paper, ribbons, paint, stickers, and your own art.

Fill the box with gifts

Remember that these must be NEW and age-appropriate items.
