Staying Ahead of Prescription Drug Abuse

In the summer of 2012, numerous agencies, service providers, health care providers, professionals and community members formed the Columbia-Greene Controlled Substance Awareness



Task Force (CGCSATF). The goal of this group is to increase the awareness of controlled substance abuse thus decreasing misuse and abuse. The CGCSATF developed two workgroups under their guise; The Practice Guidelines Workgroup and The Prevention Workgroup. The Practice Guidelines Workgroup considers the role that providers, practitioners and others may play in curtailing the misuse and abuse of prescription drugs by identifying and sharing best practices. The Prevention Workgroup focuses its efforts on increasing awareness of the misuse and abuse of controlled substances through education and collaboration.

In September 2013 Catholic Charities of Columbia and Greene Counties received the Health Living Grant sponsored by the (continued on page 2)



Staying Ahead continued.....AMA Foundation. The purpose of the grant was to focus on increasing the education and awareness of the dangers of misuse and abuse of controlled substances. In collaboration with The Prevention Workgroup and Twin County Recovery Services a plan was developed and set into motion to carry out an education and awareness campaign throughout Columbia and Greene Counties. Catholic Charities' Prevention Educators developed an easy to use School Tool Kit which was shared by each of the counties' Substance Abuse Prevention Educators to all twelve of our local school districts. This Kit included information for parents, children and schools along with specific ideas and lesson plans which schools could use and incorporate into their existing curriculum. Additionally schools were encouraged to designate the week of April 7th, 2013, Prescription Drug Awareness Week and participate in an awareness campaign poster contest. The response

to the Tool Kits was very positive and many schools did not hesitate to follow through with many of the strategies included in the Kit. Well over 100 entries were submitted for the poster contest displaying messages from our youth on making healthy choices and how to stay safe. All entries were displayed and winners were announced on June 11th at the Columbia-Greene Community College Arts Center Theater where internationally known guest speaker Michael Nerney spoke to an audience from both counties including residents from ten local school districts. Winning posters will be transformed into billboards, posters and printed cards to continue the awareness campaign into the community.

It is our hope that by sustaining this awareness campaign through use of the posters as advertisements and continued community education, the prescription drug abuse epidemic that is plaguing our community will end.
