Legislation Update

Recently, our organization hosted a meeting with world-renowned speaker, Krish Dhanam, a self-described proud immigrant who lives in Dallas, Texas.

Like many others, I found myself wanting to jump out of my seat to give a standing ovation with every new thought he shared. Krish told us about his arrival to America, his thankfulness to be a citizen, and his concerns as a patriot. In fact, he even offered a powerful plan for our republican women's club.

People often tell me they are tired of politics. Or maybe they're "tired of the fire hose of information and misinformation." Nonetheless, people are tired. As a clear battle plays out before our eyes, it is no wonder we get caught in the crossfire.

Somehow, many have been persuaded to jump into the conflict, actively participating in it by allowing themselves to be pitted against one another. The ongoing narratives in our mainstream media have become a foundation for social disharmony.

The time has come for a return to the founding foundations of honor and civility, decency and decorum.
