About Trinity Church

Trinity Church is pleased to present a solo art exhibition by local artist Linda Fedigan Hale from April 6 – 30, 2024.

Our long-established church, offers special events to our community and we welcome your participation.

On a fine, clear Spring Day, in March 1848 twenty-two men representing 20 families, gathered at the session room of the First Religious Society of Rome (later the First Presbyterian Church) and under the leadership of Reverend Alexander Wetzel a church was established.

The people of the newly formed church named themselves the United German Evangelical Lutheran Congregation of Rome and had no relationship or connection with any particular denomination. They were adjusting to the American culture and many of the men were poorly paid laborers in the mills and foundries of this thriving community.

In 1849, our forefathers erected a wood frame building on the northwest corner of South James and Ridge streets on a lot donated by the trustees of the estate of Dominick Lynch. The official dedication of the structure, which would become known as the "Little German Church" took place on October 25,1851.

In 1927 the congregation decided they needed a church more centrally located to its congregation and purchased our current facility from the Welsh Congregational Society.

Throughout its history, Trinity Church has grown and prospered however; like many churches today, Trinity faces many challenges and constantly seeks ways to address current issues and find the best ways to serve its congregation during these troubled times. We work to bring joy to others by providing much needed resources to a vast number of people in need both around the globe and locally.

Trinity welcomes all to join us at our weekly services which are held at 10:00am each Sunday in person or can be viewed at home with zoom. Our sanctuary is handicap accessible with an inside elevator.

Trinity offers a variety of activities for all ages to members and the community throughout the year.

About the Artist
