Trinity's Tidbits for October 2024

October was originally the eighth month of the Roman calendar. It comes from the Latin word "octo" meaning eight. Later, it became the 10 th month when January and February were added to the Calendar. The Saxons called the month Wintirfyllith because it had the first full moon of the winter season.

Listed are a few historic events that took place in October

October 1, 1948 – Reverend John W. Schauer Jr. was called to be pastor of Trinity Evangelical Church.

October 1, 1950 – Reverend John W. Schauer left Trinity Evangelical Church when he was called to active military service.

October 9, 1960 – A part time secretary for Trinity Church was discussed and left up to the Ladies Aid Society.

October 12, 1934 – President Franklin Delano Roosevelt designated Columbus Day a national holiday. President Biden issued a proclamation recognizing Indigenous Peoples Day in 2021. The commemoration of Native American history and culture is now federally recognized alongside Columbus Day which has been historically observed on the same Day.

October 13, 1775 – The United States navy was born after the Second Continental Congress authorized the acquisition of a fleet of ships.

October 13, 1792 - The cornerstone of the White House was laid by George Washington.

October 13, 2024 -is Pastor Appreciation Day. Acknowledge Pastor Karen for the time and dedication she has show to all the congregation at Trinity Church.

October 24 – An annual commemorative day, reflecting the official creation of the United Nations on October 24, 1945.

October 31, - All Hallows Eve – The tradition originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, when people would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward off ghosts.

October 31, 1517 – Martin Luther posted on a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, his Ninety-Five Theses, a manifesto that turned a protest about an indulgence scandal into the Protestant Reformation.

October 31, 1913 – The 1 st US paved coast to coast highway, the Lincoln Highway is dedicated. This is known as Route 30 between Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Granger, Wyoming.

October 31, 1941 – Mount Rushmore Monument is completed in South Dakota, designed by Gutzon Borglum.

October 31, 2011 – According to the United Nations Population Fund, on this day the world's population reached seven billion people.

CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATES

- 1. Insurance Update We have been told by Guide One Insurance that we will receive \$33,000 to cover the following repairs: to our copper roof above the sanctuary, roof areas on the additions, and our shed roof...to be completed by Rieben Roofing in October; the glass in three cracked windows on the rear of the building—was replaced by Erie Glass recently; the Masonry Worker will begin their work on the front right corner of the church October 4th. Thankfully, the insurance amount will cover the cost of the repairs. Thank you again to Bruce Groff for being our contact person with these contractors!!
- 2. The Hunger Walk, normally held in October, will not be held this year. Since that event raised money for local food banks, Council voted to donate \$300 each to the local Salvation Army and the Connected Community Schools to help fund their food supplies.
- 3. The Oneida Baptist Church is fund raising to make necessary repairs to their building. Council voted to send \$100 to assist them.
- 4. Our next Council meeting will be on October 20th, where we will be discussing the church budget for 2025, to be voted on by the congregation at our Congregational Meeting on November 17th, prior to our delicious Harvest Dinner.


