



## **Patricia Belyea Creativity & Inserted Curves Quilting Retreat Supply List**

### **Sewing Tools & Supplies**

- Sewing machine and gear
- Thread
- Seam ripper
- Fine pins (highly recommend Clover Fine Patchwork Pins #2507)
- Good fabric scissors
- Paper scissors
- 18" mat
- 18 - 24" gridded ruler, rotary cutter
- Good pencil & eraser
- Freezer paper

### **Dancing Xs Quilt**

For this project, you learn how to insert two curved lines into a 12" square of fabric. The ideal background fabric has large motifs. The best choices for the inserted solid lines are colors that contrast and complement the background fabric.

To make the Dancing Xs Quilt, you make 6 blocks of one color combination and 6 blocks of another color combination. The final quilt size is 33" W x 44" H.

#### **Fabrics**

Two background fabrics, with large motifs that play well together. 1 yd. each

Two contemporary solids that contrast and complement the background fabrics — 3/4 yd. each. If you have more fabric, you can make a bigger quilt!

### **Centrum Quilt**

There are two details in the Centrum Quilt to challenge you — inserting three curved lines into the central nine-patch and connecting the outer blocks to the center with a clever inner border. And, EVERYTHING stays lined up and is perfectly flat!

The project starts by designing and partially sewing the background grid. Then you design your curved insert pattern and sew the curves into the central nine-patch — before you complete the total composition. Blocks are 6" and final quilt size is 30" x 30".

#### **Fabrics**

For the background grid:

3/4 yd each of 2 fabrics. These can be high contrast patterns or low-contrast patterns. You can also use more fabrics in the background grid if they play well together to make a background grid.

For the inserts: 1/2 yd. each of three contemporary solids that look good with your background grid fabrics.
