3. **reducing stress**
4. **isolating sick animals**



Scours is another challenge to watch for. Loose stools, lethargic calves, sunken eyes, and weakness are all common signs of scour issues.

Prevention starts with:

1. **good vaccination protocol**
2. **clean calving pens and housing**
3. **high-quality colostrum at birth**

These small steps go a long way toward healthy calves and a successful recovery.

## FAQ: What is VCPR?

### VCPR = Vet-Client-Patient Relationship

VCPRs are the foundation of great veterinary care. It means your veterinarian has a thorough understanding and knowledge of your animal's medical history, health status and management system. In order to establish a VCPR an yearly examination of your pet or herd need to be done by a licensed Veterinarian. This allows them to provide personalized guidance, treatments, and prescribe medications. Without an active VCPR, your vet cannot make medical decisions and recommendations for you and your animals; It's important to keep this relationship up-to-date with annual visits to ensure your animals get the best care possible.
