COLYTE / TRILYTE WITH FLAVOR PACKS INSTRUCTIONS

It is advisable that someone be with you during this preparation process for safety reasons

- A. Approximately two to three days before the procedure we advise you to eat on the lighter side avoiding fruits and vegetables drink lots of liquids light diet consists of chicken, fish, pasta, white bread, etc.
- B. The day before the procedure: (this is your prep day)
 - 1. You may eat a light breakfast and lunch
 - 2. You may take all of you usual medications except blood thinners (Coumadin, Persantine etc.) and aspirin type products (Advil, Motrin, Ibuprophen, ect.) which should have been stopped prior to the procedure. (See below)
 - 3. Restrict your diet to clear liquids only after lunch water, clear fruit juices, bouillon, jello (avoid red jello). No solid foods, milk, or milk products.
 - 4. Mix the Colyte /TriLyte with Flavor Packs according to the instructions and refrigerate. (Enclosed is a prescription for the Colyte / TriLyte with Flavor Packs)
 - 5. At 4:00 pm begin drinking the Colyte / TriLyte with Flavor Packs; drink a large glass (about 10 oz.) every 10 minutes, and continue drinking until the bottle is empty. It should not take more than two (2) hours to drink the Colyte / Trilyte. The entire contents must be finished by 6:00pm.
 - 6. At bedtime, please take (4) dulcolax tabs (over the counter product)@ 10:00pm.
 - 7. Do not eat or drink anything after midnight.
 - 8. DO NOT OMIT ANY PART OF THE PREPARATION A poor preparation may cause a polyp or cancer to go undetected.

On the day of the procedure: do not eat or drink anything. However, you make take your routine medications (cardiac/hypertension) with small sips of water. Bring inhalers with you. IMPORTANT

*If you take blood thinners, e.g., aspirin, Ecotrin, Persantine, dipyridamole, Feldene, **Plavix**, Trental, Voltaren, Vioxx, Daypro, Vitamin E, Multi-Vitamins, all herbal supplements e.g. Omega III (fish & flaxseed oil) Gingko, Celebrex, Mobic, Bextra or non-steroidal anti-inflammatories, e.g., Motrin, Advil, Aleve, Ibuprofen, etc. they **MUST** be stopped **ONE** (1) week prior to the procedure.

*If you take the blood thinner Coumadin (Warafin), please call your physician to ask for permission to stop this *Five* (5) days prior to the procedure.

*If you take antibiotics prophylactically for any dental procedure, please notify this office. <u>Note:</u> <u>Mitral Valve Prolpase is no longer considered to be an indication for antibiotic prophylaxis for a colonoscopy or upper endoscopy</u>

*If you have a cold (upper respiratory infection) days prior to this procedure please call this office perhaps cancellation and rescheduling will be necessary.

We request that you speak with either your internist or cardiologist and notify him/her that you are about to undergo a full colonoscopic evaluation. His/her medical input is important to us for your care and direction throughout your procedure.

PREGNANCY

If there is a chance, no matter how slim, that you could be pregnant, we MUST be notified and your colonoscopy will be rescheduled to a later date.

<u>INSULIN DIABETIC</u> please check with your medical doctor on *INSULIN DOSE*; for the day of your preparation; we recommend your colonoscopy be first in the morning with **NO** insulin on board, bringing your insulin with you but please check with your medical doctor.
